#### **Annual General Meeting 2020 -**

CASSA's Annual General Meeting took place on Wednesday October 21st, 2020, 6-8pm on Zoom. The focus of the AGM was on Employment Equity as we released the findings of our 3-year research study on Employment Equity for South Asian Immigrant Communities in Toronto. The event also featured a panel discussion on the impact of COVID-19 on employment for South Asians in Ontario with special guests Milan Nadarajah, Herleen Arora, and Dr. Yilmaz Dinc. Milan Nadarajah, Organizer at the Workers' Action Centre, presented on the impact of COVID-19 on precarious workers, particularly those who are South Asian, otherwise racialized, and/or with precarious immigration status in relation to their employment and health. Herleen Arora, Educator, Consultant, and Cofounder of Womxn Offering Wisdom and Partnership Development Officer at the Future Skills Centre, presented on the impact of COVID-19 on South Asian women in relation to their employability, health, and wellbeing and the importance of childcare reform. Dr. Yilmaz Dinc, Research and Evaluation Manager at Toronto Region Immigrant Employment Council (TRIEC) presented on the impact of COVID-19 on immigrants, employment equity and upward mobility and policy changes that are urgently needed.

#### **Employment Equity for South Asians -**

CASSA held its Annual General Meeting on October 21, 2020. During this meeting, CASSA launched the Needs-Assessment and Policy Report for their Research on Employment Equity for South Asian Immigrant Communities in Toronto.

Following this launch, over the next six to eight months, CASSA will be conducting an advocacy campaign to bring attention to the issues highlighted in the reports and our recommendations. 



### Indians biggest beneficiaries as Canada to admit 401,000 new immigrants

Indian immigration into Canada has jumped exponentially in the last three to four years. While 39,340 Indian immigrants were admitted in 2016, the figures jumped to 85,000 in 2019—a rise of 105 per cent. Immigration Minister Marco Mendicino said on Friday while announcing the new immigration targets, "Newcomers are playing an outsized role in our hospitals and care homes, and helping us to keep food on the table."

### Teachers at Scarborough school refusing to work after COVID-19 outbreak

Teachers at a Scarborough elementary school - Glamorgan Junior P.S - refuse to work Monday over fears for safety after their school remained opened despite a confirmed COVID-19 outbreak.

A number of staff at a Scarborough elementary school with 11 confirmed COVID-19 cases and another 58 students in self-isolation refused to work there on Monday and it is unclear whether they will return to their classrooms tomorrow.

The work refusal left only 11 adults to supervise children who remained at the school by mid-morning on Monday.
