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

On July 14th, we hosted our 11th Annual Health Equity Summit, themed Shifting and Sharing Power: Community Engagement for Reducing Health Inequities. The Health Equity Summit is a recognizable event that CASSA hosts annually to address health-related disparities, particularly those that affect South Asian communities and other racialized communities – through the exchange of knowledge between key stakeholders.

The event was a great success, with speakers from organizations such as the Upstream Lab, Regent Community Health Centre, and the Wellesley Institute, among others. The summit provided an opportunity for public health professionals, community leaders, researchers, academics, social service providers, and decision-makers alike to demonstrate the value of community engagement as a core public health practice.

Toxic Masculinity and Its Impact on Gender-Based Violence

CASSA has undertaken a second gender-based violence research project, with this one focusing on toxic and harmful masculinities. This project will explore the impact of toxic masculinity on gender-based violence. Currently, we are seeking participants for the research phase of the project, examining the impact of harmful masculinities on gender-based violence. This data will then be used to create awareness tools and intervention materials. The identity of all participants will be kept strictly confidential and anonymity will be ensured during focus groups. 




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Violence Against Women (VAW) Counsellor Job Posting:


