Hate Crime Reporting Project

The hate crime reporting project has concluded the data collection and analysis phase, and the team is currently developing training materials for the project's police service partners. National GBV Research Project

The GBV study has been moving forward into the writing phase of the study as we look into recurrent themes in the datasets. As one of the outcomes of the study will be a GBV toolkit, the team has been researching previously published toolkits on GBV and intimate partner violence in order to gauge gaps that can be filled in by the study. The team has also decided on other outcomes that will occur during the dissemination phase of the project. This will include training sessions for agencies on the needs GBV survivors have had in accessing help during the pandemic. We have also discussed a variety of media outlets to publish our findings in, which will be shared in the coming months.



Seeking immigrant women for a research study

Background:

- Physical activity can reduce the risk of developing many types of cancer
- Research in other countries shows that immigrant women have low physical activity
- We do not know if immigrant women in Canada are physically active

Study purpose:

Describe physical activity among Canadian immigrant women

You can participate if you:

- Are 18 years of age or older
- Immigrated to Canada in the last 10 years from their country of origin or via another country
- Are Chinese, Filipino, Indian, Pakistani or Caribbean or African Black
- Of any immigration status, but not refugee
- Have not had cancer in the past and do not currently have cancer
- Can understand and speak English language

What you will be asked to do:

- Read and sign a consent form that we will send you
- Speak with us by telephone for about 30 minutes
- We will ask about your physical activity and what influences your physical activity
- We will type the answers you tell us

What we will give you:

- After the call, we will send you a gift card
- When the study is done, we will send you a summary of the results
