

### The Coalition for Racial Equity in Education

# What is BILL 21?

- Bill 21 was passed on June 2019 in Quebec. The law restricts public servants from wearing **religious garments or symbols** while at work.
- The law was approved based on Section 33 yet also acknowledged that the law restricts religious liberty.
- Section 33 of the constitution allows the government to **ignore** a provision of the Charter, hence the bill is constitutionally acceptable.
- Numerous organizations have voiced their opposition to Bill 21.
- The case has been jointly brought to the highest court in Quebec by NCCM and CCLA.
