

CASSA has also dedicated many months working on receiving an ethics approval from the Community Research Ethics Office (CREO) and is happy to announce that we have received the approval. Since receiving this from CREO, CASSA has designed and conducted training sessions for all partners to understand their obligations and the materials that have been distributed. At the moment, partners have begun participant recruitment within the South Asian community in Canada. CASSA will be there with partners every step of the way in order to ensure focus groups and surveys are conducted in an ethical and transparent manner. 
Canada Child Benefit Contingency on Immigration Status





These quotations are based on primary research consisting on interviews. Identity of the interview participants is kept confidential to maintain privacy.






