

The [Annual Health Equity Summit](#), hosted by CASSA, is dedicated to addressing health disparities that disproportionately affect marginalized communities, with a particular focus on South Asian and other racialized groups. This year's 14th Annual Health Equity Summit is titled *Equity in Focus: Sexual and Reproductive Health for South Asian Newcomer Women*. The Summit will be a virtual event via **Zoom on Tuesday, November 18, 2025 from 10:00 AM – 2:00 PM**.

The Summit will explore the social, cultural, and systemic factors shaping sexual and reproductive health (SRH) outcomes for newcomer women, with a focus on addressing barriers to access, culturally responsive care, and stigma. Bringing together policymakers, healthcare providers, researchers, and community leaders, the event will combine keynote presentations and policy-focused discussions with service-oriented breakout sessions. These sessions will provide practical strategies for improving maternal and perinatal care, gynecological care, and sexual health education, leaving them with actionable insights to ensure that South Asian newcomer women receive culturally sensitive, timely, and comprehensive support throughout the critical stages of their reproductive health journey.

CASSA Project Updates

South Asian International Students Research Project

The South Asian International Students Research Project is actively seeking participants for the ongoing study. This research aims to delve into the experiences and challenges faced by South Asian international students in Ontario. The project has interviewed about 24 participants so far.

Participant Eligibility:

- South Asian international students
- 16 years or older
- Currently enrolled in a post-secondary educational institution in Ontario

Community Partners & Institutional Staff Interviews: In addition to student interviews, we are also engaging with community partners and institutional staff who work closely with international students. These interviews will provide diverse perspectives on the challenges faced by South Asian international students and help inform our research.

Data Analysis and Report: Starting from July 2025, the collected data will be transcribed and analyzed according to the theoretical framework of "education of other." A comprehensive report will then be prepared based on these findings.

On September 13, 2025, CASSA (Council of Agencies Serving South Asians), in South Asian Social Justice Network Alberta, successfully hosted the **Community Resource Fair** at the Genesis Centre in Calgary.

The event welcomed **over 100 community members** who had the opportunity to learn about a wide range of resources and services tailored for the South Asian community. Topics included immigrant and newcomer support, employment, education, settlement, mental health, domestic violence, youth programming, and more.

A total of **nine community organizations** showcased their programs and services through interactive booths. Their presence ensured that participants could directly connect with service providers, ask questions, and access vital information to support themselves and their families.

This event highlighted the strong collaboration among community organizations in Calgary, reflecting a shared commitment to empowerment, inclusivity, and community well-being.

South Asian Social Justice Network Project - Quebec

SASJN Quebec Monthly Meeting-September 29:

Participants: Shaheen Junaid, Dr. Sameena Iqbal and Abdul Majeed

Dr. Sameena emphasized the need for education and multicultural awareness to foster respect for visible minorities, particularly Muslims. Participants highlight the importance of inclusiveness, encouraging Muslim involvement in schools and communities despite challenges such as restrictive policies. Community engagement through centers, charities, and intercultural events like Ramadan or Eid gatherings is seen as key to overcoming isolation and reducing prejudice. Concerns are raised about internal barriers within some Muslim institutions and the need to promote integration rather than exclusivity. The conversation also addresses Hindutva-related tensions, urging focus on shared Canadian values and multicultural harmony. Recommendations include multilingual communication (English, French, Arabic), addressing educational disparities faced by Muslim children, and enhancing mental health awareness through accessible, community led initiatives.

Taking the Honour Out of 'Honour-Based Violence' Project

Our ongoing project explores 'honour-based violence' (HBV) within South Asian communities in Canada. Following a scoping review to identify service gaps, we conducted consultations with survivors and subject matter experts to understand how HBV is experienced and addressed. These findings are being analyzed to develop practical, culturally responsive recommendations. We're currently finalizing a 'train-the-trainer' module to equip frontline workers with tools to

toward improved support for South Asian women affected by HBV.






