On November 18, 2025, CASSA will host its 14th Annual Health Equity Summit with the theme *Equity in Focus: Sexual and Reproductive Health for South Asian Newcomer Women*. The summit will bring together policymakers, healthcare providers, researchers, and community leaders to examine barriers, stigma, and systemic challenges shaping sexual and reproductive health outcomes. Through keynote presentations, policy discussions, and breakout sessions, participants will gain practical strategies to strengthen maternal care, family planning, and sexual health education, advancing equity for newcomer South Asian women across Ontario.

CASSA Project Updates

South Asian International Students Research Project

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Asian international students in Ontario. The project has interviewed about 24 participants so far.

Participant Eligibility:

- South Asian international students
- 16 years or older
- Currently enrolled in a post-secondary educational institution in Ontario

So far, we have successfully conducted interviews with 24 students from a diverse range of institutions. We are now looking to recruit at least 6 more participants.

Community Partners & Institutional Staff Interviews: In addition to student interviews, we are also engaging with community partners and institutional staff who work closely with international students. These interviews will provide diverse perspectives on the challenges faced by South Asian international students and help inform our research.

Data Analysis and Report: Starting from July 2025, the collected data will be transcribed and analyzed according to the theoretical framework of "education of other." A comprehensive report will then be prepared based on these findings.

Taking the Honour Out of 'Honour-Based Violence' Project

Our ongoing project explores 'honour-based violence' (HBV) within South Asian communities in Canada. Following a scoping review to identify service gaps, we conducted consultations with survivors and subject matter experts to understand how HBV is experienced and addressed.

These findings are being analyzed to develop practical, culturally responsive recommendations.

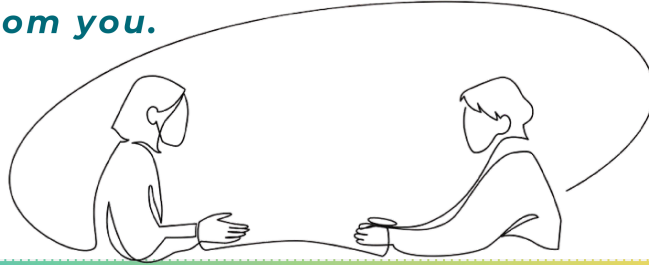

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



Are you a youth or young adult who has a disability and identifies as belonging to a sex/gender minoritized group? Consider participating as part of a larger study about youth with disabilities' experiences in looking for work or being employed.

What is this study about?

We want to understand your experiences looking for work or being employed. Specifically, we want to learn about how your minoritized identity impacts your workplace or job-seeking experiences. In addition, we want to learn about disability disclosure and how youth with disabilities ask for accommodations in the workplace.

Who can participate?

We are looking for:

- Youth with a disability aged 15-30
- Identify as belonging to a sex/gender minoritized group
- Able to speak in English (or with the help of an interpreter)
- Currently employed or have work experience

What's involved?

Participants will be asked to take part in:

- 1 interview (approx. 1 hour) over the phone or over Zoom

What are the risks and benefits of participating?

- A benefit of participating includes helping us to learn about disclosure and accommodation processes to better meet the needs of sex/gender minoritized youth with disabilities.
